

Fight Parkinson's Seed Funding Grants 2025

Seed funding grant applications for projects commencing in 2025 are now open.

Overview

- Fight Parkinson's is calling for applications for seed funding grants.
 - o Clinical Research \$30,000
 - Basic Science Research \$30,000
- Annual grant program, seeking requests for research able to be delivered within a 12-month timeframe.
- Fight Parkinson's seeks to invest in research in support of prevention, improving the lives of People living with Parkinson's, PSP, CBS or MSA and eventually finding a cure for these conditions.
- We will support innovative team-based approaches seeking to develop ideas that will facilitate larger grant schemes.
- Applications will be assessed based on potential impact on the Parkinson's Community, scientific merit, significance, and team track record.
- Grants will be evaluated by the Fight Parkinson's Grants Review Committee, whose decisions shall be considered final.

Applications, Eligibility, Conditions and Assessment Criteria

Objectives of Fight Parkinson's Seed Funding Grants in Parkinson's Disease, PSP, CBS and MSA

- To provide financial support for research projects conducted in part or fully in Victoria.
- To improve evidenced based knowledge.
- To stimulate research activities.
- To increase the capacity of research teams.
- To facilitate communication between scientists\clinicians and Fight Parkinson's members.
- To support innovative team-based approaches seeking to develop ideas that will facilitate larger grant schemes.

Conditions of the Fight Parkinson's seed funding grants

- Applicant will hold a PhD or be a qualified clinician.
- An insitutional enticial approval is required prior to commencement.
- Successful applicants will be required to present research to the Fight Parkinson's community during or after the project.



Together we can

- All publications or presentations emanating from an approved project must acknowledge Fight Parkinson's.
- Electronic copies of all publications will be forwarded to Fight Parkinson's.

Eligibility and terms

- The funds will be made available as a one-off payment to eligible researchers and must be used entirely for the research described in the application.
- A maximum of \$3,000 will be permitted for infrastructure and oncosts.
- Institutional ethical approval of the research project will be required before payment of the grant.
- The research is to be undertaken in Victoria.
- The grantee must demonstrate that the grant can proceed without relying on additional unsecured funds.

Selection Criteria

- The project is consistent with the aims of this grant.
- Academic record.
- Quality of the team.
- Potential for the project to have impact on the Parkinson's community.
- Willingness to participate with Fight Parkinson's community.
- Budget demonstrates the research is feasible.

How to Apply

The application must be received as a single PDF by email to <u>info@fightparkinsons.org.au</u>, attention to Fight Parkinson's Grants Review Committee, and must be received by **5:00pm on Wednesday 12 March 2025**.

The application shall consist of:

1) **Front cover,** to include:

- a) Project name.
- b) Applicants name and contact details.
- c) Research team names, email address and contact information.
- d) Name of the institution through which the project will be performed.
- e) Statement that the team will comply with the conditions of the award.
- 2) A one page description of the project in lay language. This page should include the potential impact of the award to the Parkinsons community and to the research team.



Together we can

- 3) **Up to two pages of project description,** that includes background, hypotheisis and aims.
- 4) A two page CV of each of the research team. This should include:
 - a) Total number of publications.
 - b) Number of publications in the last five years.
 - c) Total number of citations.
 - d) Number of citations in the last five years.
 - e) Web link (e.g. NCBI, Orcid, Researcher ID) to a full list of publications.
 - f) H factor must be used.
 - g) Five best publications and how they impacted the field.
 - h) Current funded grants.
 - i) Confirmed other sources of funding for this grant.
- 5) A full copy of the ethical approval of the project (if available).
- 6) **Disclosure of conflicts of interest.**
- 7) Full research budget.

Applications close at 5:00pm on Wednesday 12 March 2025.

Applications must be received as a single PDF by email to <u>info@fightparkinsons.org.au</u>, attention to Fight Parkinson's Grants Review Committee.

Successful grant recipients will be notified and announced early-April 2025.
